

Students may also enroll in Advanced Placement (AP) courses, which prepares them to take AP Exams. Students who elect to take AP Exams and earn qualifying scores on these exams may receive college credit for this rigorous coursework.

Articulation

Articulation is a process for coordinating the linking of two or more educational systems to help students make a smooth transition from one level to another without experiencing delays, duplication of courses or loss of credit. Establishing such agreements between the high school and the junior college, technical school or other post secondary learning institution is an ongoing process. Contact a high school counselor for current information related to articulation.

Weighted Grades

For all high school courses that are available for college credit, Advanced Placement, or classified as Honors additional points on the grade point average scale can be earned for the grades of A, B, and C. The weight, per grade, is one additional point.

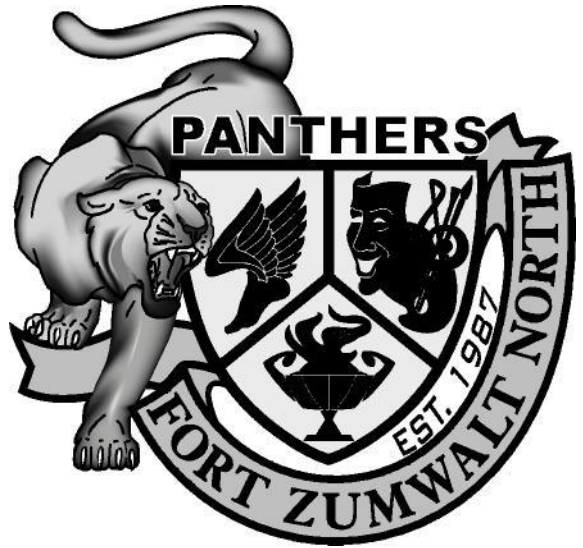
Extra Curricular Activities

College Credit Programs

The district has cooperative, dual enrollment programs with the following colleges and/or universities:

- St. Louis University
- University of Missouri - St. Louis
- Missouri Baptist College
- St. Charles Community College
- Lindenwood University
- Drury University- Springfield

Through these agreements, Juniors and Seniors with required high school prerequisites can enroll in advanced high school courses for college credit. Each college has different requirements and guidelines for its program. Each college establishes its tuition rate during the summer; enrollment for college credit is taken at the beginning of each semester in appropriate courses. The student and/or parent is responsible for all college fees for courses taken for college credit.

Courses available for college credit are determined annually based upon approval by the college. The list of courses available for college credit is included in the Course Description Handbook available for registration each spring.
